GUEST SOLOISTS

Sergeant John Maiocco

Sergeant Maiocco is Assistant Principal Cornet in the United States Air Force Band and Principal Trumpet in the Air Force Symphony Orchestra. A native of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, he began studying the violin at the age of eleven then switched to trumpet two years later. He has studied at the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia and from 1944 to 1948 he was Principal Trumpet with the Ballet Russe De Monte Carlo Orchestra. In 1948 Sergeant Maiocco joined New York City's Ballet Theatre Orchestra as Principal Trumpet. In 1952 he joined the U.S. Air Force Band.

Sergeant Larry Wiehe

Sergeant Wiehe, featured Instrumental soloist with the U.S.Air Force Band has been acclaimed throughout the world as one of today's leading Trombone Virtuosos. His fantastic technique and impeccable artistry keep him in constant demand throughout America as a music clinician. A native of Centralia, Illinois, Sergeant Wiehe began studying trombone when he was only four years old. Between grades 4 and 12, he entered over 40 District, State and National Contests and carried top honors in each one!

Sergeant Wiehe studied at North Texas State University and served in the U.S. Navy, including 12 years as featured soloist with the U.S. Navy Band. He joined the U.S. Air Force Band in 1963.

Sergeant Robert Chab

Sergeant Chab has been with the Air Force Music Program since his graduation from the University of Nebraska in 1953. Born in Ravenna, Nebraska, Sergeant Chab began to study the piano at age 8 and switched to Tuba, his principal instrument, at age 13. He was a member of the Lincoln Symphony and served with Air Force Bands in California and Salina, Kansas. In 1955 he was assigned to the United States Air Force Band.

GUEST CONDUCTOR

Major Albert Bader

Major Bader, Assistant Conductor of the United States Air Force Band, received a direct commission in 1965 to Captain in the Air Force, after serving the Military Music Program in every enlisted grade for over 17 years. He was immediately appointed Assistant Conductor of the U.S. Air Force's Premiere Musical Organization.

A native of St. Louis, Missouri, Major Bader began his service career in 1943, serving with the 40th Infantry Division in the New Britain and Philippine Island Campaigns. While working on his masters degree at the St. Louis Institute of Music he was recalled into the Army during the Korean Conflict. There he was appointed Assistant Band Leader of the 8th Army Band. In 1952 Major Bader was assigned to the Air Force School of Music in Washington, D. C. and in 1953 he became Assistant Director of the Air Force's Headquarters Command Band. Following this, he was appointed Chief Instructor of the Air Force School of Music and placed in charge of the entire curriculum. Immediately prior to being appointed Assistant Conductor of the U.S. Air Force Band he had been assigned to the Band as Section Leader of the Band's Saxophone Section.

"Concertino for Three Brass and Band written by Sergeant Floyd Werle, Chief Arranger for the United States Air Force Band, Symphony Orchestra and the singing sergeants.

Sergeant Werle has to his credit hundreds of band transcriptions of orchestral scores, as well as many arrangements of popular works of the past few years. He has also contributed original scores for 12 motion pictures.

The Concertino was originally written for a trio consisting of "Doc" Severinsen, Trumpet; Larry Wiehe, Trombone; and Bill Bell, Tuba.
